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**Skäl till anmälan**

- 1) The journalist forcefully entered my private room and shouting on top of his voice traumatising everybody in the office with threats. I Proscovia Kisémbó specifically denied him consent to take my pictures but he has been publishing them on many occasions. I have a police report in which his misconduct and intrusive behaviour was reported
- 2) Information given to this journalist was deliberately misconstrued, twisted and misreported to depict an untrue situation in Kikuube and among our families.
- 3) Consent to having the Pictures of farmers and those of their families to be taken was sought under the false pretence that these will be used to depict these farmers as role model farmers.
- 4) The story is demeaning of the way we have chosen to live our lives, including the use of a derogatory term – 'Hunger Forest' to describe our agroforestry system. We Trees for Global Benefit farmers believe that this is a deliberate well calculated attempt to lock us out of carbon market and ultimately into poverty. We take exception to this language as well as the tokenising of our children and assert that there is nothing about ourselves or our children and our homes that should cause this journalist to describe our families in such belittling language.
- 5) The words in the article do not in anyway represent what Wilson Akiiza, Violet Mbabazi, Gerald Agaba and Janet Twinomajuni said to the journalist. These are farmers who have willingly chosen to derive a livelihood from agroforestry, made possible by the project. They are still active in the project, they have more than enough food and all their children are well educated.
- 6) The children whose names and pictures were published as having dropped out of school are actively attending school (except for one). We can provide you with a list of all the schools and the classes that these children attend.
